SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

First-aid measures general : Check the vital functions. Unconscious: maintain adequate airway and respiration. Respiratory arrest: artificial respiration or oxygen. Cardiac arrest: perform resuscitation. Victim conscious with laboured breathing: half-seated. Victim in shock: on his back with legs slightly raised. Vomiting: prevent asphyxia/aspiration pneumonia. Prevent cooling by covering the victim (no warming up). Keep watching the victim. Give psychological aid. Keep the victim calm, avoid physical strain. Depending on the victim's condition: doctor/hospital.

First-aid measures after inhalation : Remove the victim into fresh air. Respiratory problems: consult a doctor/medical service.

First-aid measures after skin contact : Rinse with water. Soap may be used. Take victim to a doctor if irritation persists.

First-aid measures after eye contact : Rinse with water. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Do not apply neutralizing agents. Take victim to an ophthalmologist if irritation persists.

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First-aid measures after ingestion : Rinse mouth with water. Immediately after ingestion: give lots of water to drink. Victim is fully conscious: immediately induce vomiting. Consult a doctor/medical service if you feel unwell. Take the container/vomit to the doctor/hospital. Ingestion of large quantities: immediately to hospital. Call Poison Information Centre (www.big.be/antigif.htm).

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Symptoms/effects after inhalation : EXPOSURE TO HIGH CONCENTRATIONS: Paleness. Blue/grey discolouration of the skin. Feeling of weakness. FOLLOWING SYMPTOMS MAY APPEAR LATER: Body temperature rise. Possible oedema of the upper respiratory tract. Possible laryngeal spasm/oedema.

Symptoms/effects after ingestion : Nausea. Vomiting. Abdominal pain. AFTER INGESTION OF HIGH QUANTITIES: Respiratory difficulties.

Chronic symptoms : ON CONTINUOUS/REPEATED EXPOSURE/CONTACT: Gastrointestinal complaints. Skin rash/inflammation. Respiratory difficulties.
